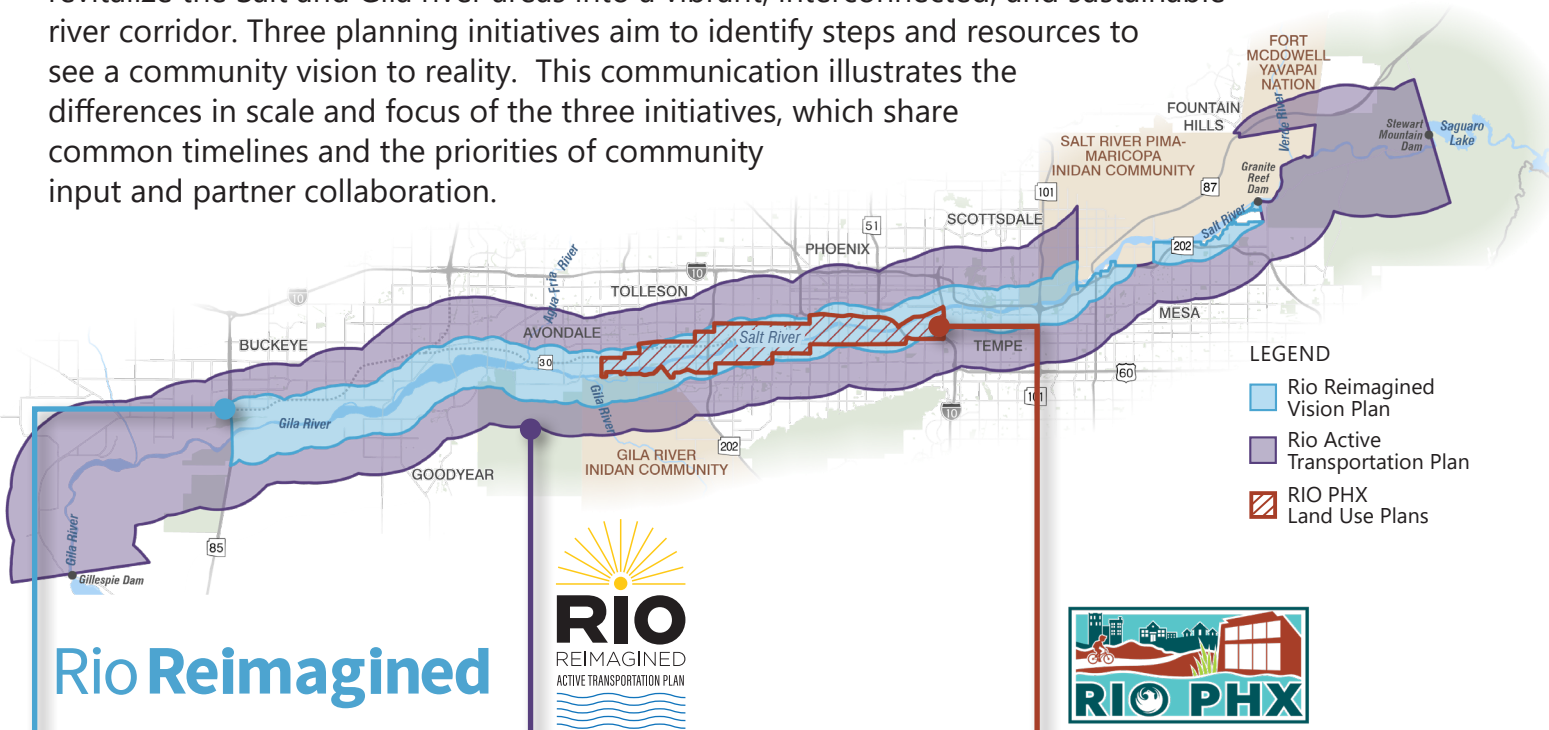


Rio Reimagined: Collaborative Planning Efforts

Rio Reimagined partners in the greater Phoenix metro region are working together to revitalize the Salt and Gila river areas into a vibrant, interconnected, and sustainable river corridor. Three planning initiatives aim to identify steps and resources to see a community vision to reality. The Rio Reimagined Vision Plan

LENGTH: 55 miles

LEAD: Arizona State University (ASU)/Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG)/Greater Phoenix Leadership (GPL)

The plan will provide the **overall vision for the corridor**. It will balance community input, environmental needs, and development priorities with funding strategies to ensure a cohesive regional impact.

LENGTH: 90 miles

LEAD: MAG

The plan is dedicated to identifying a **connected regional trail** alignment along the river corridor. It will promote safe and effective active transportation by establishing vital bicycle and pedestrian links to neighboring communities and identifying essential non-motorized infrastructure enhancements.

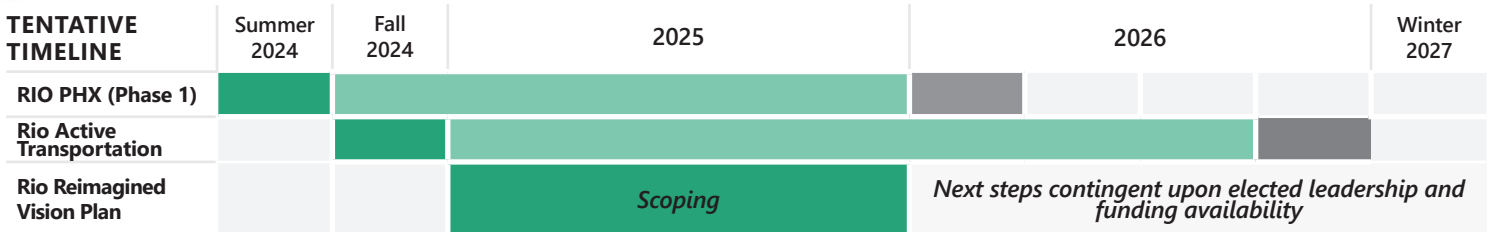
